October 15 through 21, 1951

Whereas, in this 175th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence, Pennsylvania Week becomes a great patriotic demonstration showing the Nation some of the things we are doing for national defense, that from our mines and mills, our factories and farms and all our natural resources comes the strength of America in this period of national emergency, and

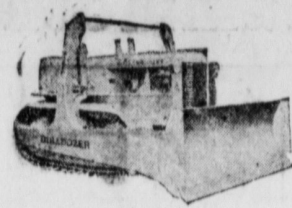
