> Vision and Delinquency Eyesight and juvenile delin quency are more closely linked than is generally known.

Unless a child can see properly, he loses interest in school and seeks other outlets for his energy, and he may turn to window-breaking or petty thievery.

Two out of three retarded readers in the lower grades have inadequate vision, and the child who has trouble reading is not likely

to enjoy school. "It is natural for every child to want to be outstanding in something," researchers say. "If he feels inferior in school he may try to draw attention to himself by being the leader of a gang of vandals. He will turn to activities in which his vision or reading will not handicap him.
