Members of council have announced that full payment has been made on the new fire truck.

Burgess Fish reported that the East Donegal Twp. supervisors had protested the annexation of the Gingrich development (Pleasant View) to the boro, but that the State overruled the protests and children living in that area will attend Mt. Joy schools and the boro will receive the taxes.

Council passed a motion to sign the architect's agreement for building the fire house annex. This has been delayed for sometime due to amendments added at the suggestion of the boro solicitor. The architects also OK'd the agreement.

for 1,000 persons; an auditorium seating 800, and a cafeteria seating 200.

Plans are also being made for home making unit, art room, shop classroom and a mill testing laboratory, and a shop unit consisting of agricultural, general woodworking and metal shops with a planning center.
