VINCENT R. TORTORA SPOKE ON RUSSIAN IDEOLOGIES

One of the most interesting speakers ever to address the Rotary Club was heard at Tuesday's luncheon meeting.

He was Vincent R. Tortora, a graduate of Franklin and Marshall College, who, with the aid of forged documents identifying him as an Italian Communist, was able to enter and remain in the "Iron Curtain" zone for twenty-five days.

He spoke on the "World Youth Peace Festival" sponsored by the Communists in East Berlin, to which he was granted entrance as a "correspondent for an Italian Communist newspaper", and on the various forms of Communist propaganda.

SHORT OF FUNDS, COUNTY PROJECTS GET AXE

Three more Lancaster County projects have suffered from the economy axe in Harrisburg.

The State Senate, seeking to pare expenses to rock bottom, has lopped off these House-passed appropriations:

Penna's Farm Museum (Landis-Valley Museum), \$25,000; Lancaster Heart Association, \$10,000; and Stiegel research at Manheim, \$8,000

That makes a total of \$135,000 worth of Lancaster County projects cancelled out.
