Be sure your fuses are of correct amperage for your circuits—15 amperes usually are right, and don't tamper with this "safety valve."

A few common sense precautions:

1. Employ a skilled electrician to repair or extend wiring when this is necessary.
2. Buy electric appliances and cords bearing the seal or label of Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc.
3. Don't string wires under rugs, over hooks, or in any exposed place. Wear may make them dangerous.
