**Chief Myers' Report**  
In his report for 1951, Fire Chief

Ray Myers has reported 26 fire calls, 12 of which were in the borough. The fire loss is incomplete since the loss from one recent fire has not been determined.

burned all the cut wood) living on canned peas, beans, peaches, potatoes, onions, flour, sugar, coffee, preserves, etc. until the supply was exhausted.

He was seen in the Camp and even invited a neighbor, who did visit with him while he was there. He told the neighbors he knew the owners. (Their names on the Deer Hunting Roster were still posted.)

Evidently the thief is no dumbbell. Every door and window at Buck Ridge Lodge is bolted and locked. One door had the key in the lock on the inside. The other door is secured with a special night latch. The man gained entrance in a manner that left absolutely no marks or trace and departed the same way, leaving everything securely locked.

Quite a number of other camps throughout that section were also entered and personal property stolen. All indications point to this same individual.

At the home of Conrad Swartz, about two miles from Buck Ridge Lodge, this same thief, in broad daylight, went to Swartz's car, removed the battery and carried it away. Mr. Swartz saw the thief, loaded his double barrel shot gun and watched the procedure but did not shoot. He did not want to cripple the young man.

The thief tells natives his home is at Lancaster. To others he says Carlisle. There is every indication that the latter is correct.

Many of the thefts have been placed in the hands of the Penna. State Police as well as Perry County authorities and there is every indication that the thief's liberties are limited.

In addition to the above mentioned camp, others owned in that locality are Mr. and Mrs. Elwood Martin and The Mateers, of town; Eph. Arndt, Florin; Elizabethtown Camp, and others. This same thief's car was parked at the new church several hundred yards from a camp owned by Frank Singer, of Maytown for several days. We have not learned whether or not any of the camps in this vicinity were molested. We have, however learned that a dwelling owned by a Harrisburg family, both of whom died recently was ransacked.
