ORDINANCE  
AN ORDINANCE FORBIDDING OPEN BONFIRES AFTER SUN-DOWN, AND IMPOSING PENALTIES.

It is hereby ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to kindle or maintain later than one hour after sundown any bonfire or other fire on or in any street, avenue, road, land or public ground, or upon any private lot within the limits of the Borough of Mount Joy, when such bonfire or other fire shall not be within the confines of an incinerator or other safe container as approved by the Fire Chief or Burgess of the Borough.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the terms hereof shall, upon summary conviction be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$25.00, and in default thereof, to undergo imprisonment for a period not exceeding 25 days.
