 delayed, but it is the only choice of the carrier. So in the future, please be sure that the approach to your box is kept free of ice and snow at all times. You will receive your mail promptly and without delay, and it will lessen the burden of the carrier a great deal, especially during the winter months.  
 As for folks who get mail in Mt. Joy and have storm doors, may I suggest that if you do not have a slot in the storm door, that you erect some receptacle outside the door in which you receive your mail. There have been several instances where in making delivery of mail to a patron, and it was necessary for the carrier to open the storm door to get to the receptacle, that the door was damaged by wind. The Department will not pay

for any damages that occur in this manner. Therefore it will be to your advantage to have a receptacle placed outside the storm door, rather than have the carrier open the door, and maybe run the risk of having it damaged by wind as the case has been.

If you may have any questions concerning these items, you are free at all times to call at the office and discuss the matter with us. Your cooperation in these matters will be greatly appreciated.
