Council also approved the exoneration of \$1,934 in per capita tax which affected 298 persons.

The rumors contained the assurance that Olmsted Field at Middletown will stay in operation. It had been said previously that Middletown would have to close if the base did not go in the immediate area.

Air Force spokesmen today said no decision has been reached although sites are being investigated in Dauphin, Lebanon, Schuylkill, Carbon and Monroe Counties as well as Lancaster County.

Members of Congress who have been urging various sites for the depot also said they knew of no new developments, although Assistant Secretary of the Air Force Edwin V. Huggins said last month that a recommendation might be sent to Congress around the middle of February.

The Lancaster Intelligencer Journal published an article Saturday stating that it had learned on Friday that the proposed \$62 million Air Force aircraft maintenance and supply depot will not be located in Lancaster County, or Pennsylvania, either.

A Political Threat
Members of the executive committee of the United Citizens' committee of Lancaster County in favor of the Air Base threatened to take the whole issue to the voters at the Presidential Primary.

Reports coming from the meeting indicated that the executive committee members blame the adverse developments upon "political conditions" and feel that Rep. Paul B. Dague is the leader of the opposing forces.

They even threaten to run their own candidate for Congress from the 9th District.

43,000 DRIVERS BANNED OVER HALF FOR SPEEDING

More than half of the 43,000 motorists who lost driving privileges on Pennsylvania highways last year were arrested for speeding.

Otto F. Messner, state revenue secretary, said 24,500 operators had their licenses suspended for exceeding speed limits. Some 10,000 were out-of-state motorists. Drunken driving was responsible for 3,261 revocations.

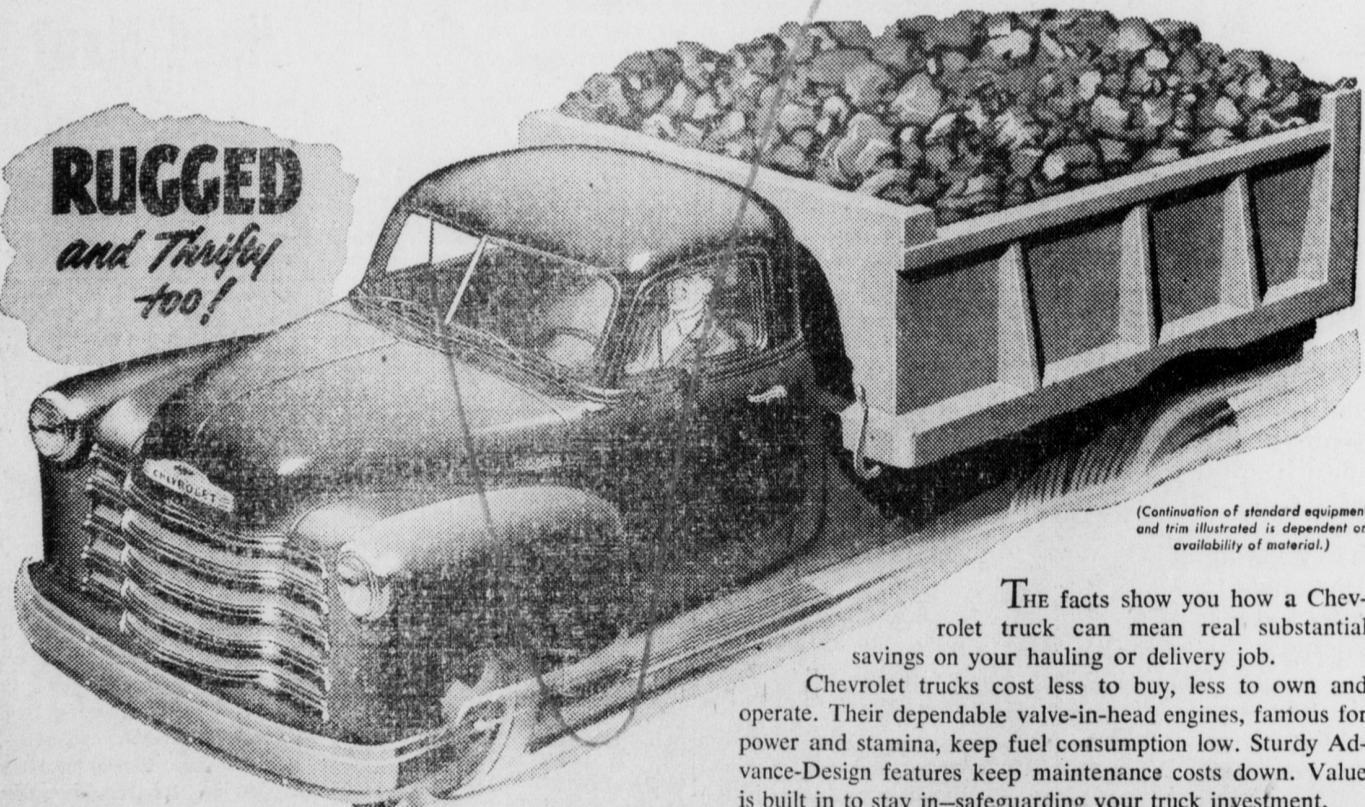
