The Messiah Orphanage

Nearly one hundred years ago a family that had come from Germany lived in the town of Florin. This family was very poor, and some people of the Brethren in Christ Church gave them considerable help. These people had a daughter by the name of Barbara Ann Kern. Miss Kern went West upon maturity and was fortunate in accumulating some means. To show her appreciation for the kindness shown to her parents, she donated three thousand dollars for the erection of an orphanage building. This building was erected in Harrisburg and was owned by the Brethren in Christ Church. It was built in 1900, but it was soon discovered that this location in the city was not ideal. So it was decided to move the orphanage to Grant, Pa., where the work was carried on for a number of years. This location, too, did not prove ideal. It was felt that it would be a distinct advantage to have it located where more of the church people lived; so it was again moved to its present location near Florin, where Miss Kern's parents had been befriended years before. This took place in 1924. To date, nearly four hundred children have been in the care of the orphanage for various periods of time. The original purpose of founding the orphanage was to provide a home for unfortunate children, such as have lost one or both parents. Others whose parents do not take proper care of them were also admitted. The aims of the institution are to provide a home where they are taught about God, industry, and how to take care of their bodies. It is interested in getting as many orphans as possible into good private homes, where folks are more interested in what they can do FOR a child than they are in what they can get OUT of the child. The orphanage received meat, fruits and vegetables which are donated by friends, officials reported. At present there are approximately 37 children under orphanage care. Fourteen of these are at the orphanage under the care of Miss Mazie Suse and Miss June Cross. Owned and operated by the Brethren in Christ Church, a Board of Directors and Trustees serve as overseers.
