Question

### WHAT ABOUT RABIES?

Q: How is rables spread? A: It is spread by the bite of an animal that has the disease. It can also be spread if saliva from a

fection. Q: Is this disease dangerous to both human beings and animals? A: Yes. It can kill people, as



by protective vaccination. Q: How successful is vaccina

A: Very dependable. Authorities now recommend this control program: All dogs in an area should be vaccinated. Stray dogs should be impounded. Any dogs being shipped from one area to another should be required to have a rabies vaccination certificate. This plan has brought rabies under effective control in communities.

Q: How does one recognize ra-

A: Suspect rabies when dogs or rabies, in which their jaws are paralyzed and their mouths hang open; or the furious type where they want to bite anything within

Q: If rabies is suspected, what should one do? A: Contact a veterinarian immediately. Confine any suspect dog or farm animal. Do not kill the animal. If a person is bitten, call a physician immediately. NOTE-Due to space limitation,
