or union school district and at this meeting three of the boards, except West Donegal Twp., indicated they favored a union district.

After the benefits of the union districts were explained by G. Reed Alexander, temporary chairman, with the assistance of the solicitors, the West Donegal Twp. members held a private session after which they voted in favor of a union district.

Consequently the solicitors were instructed to draw up a petition to have the question of a union school district placed on the ballot at the general election so the matter can be voted upon.

The directors also named a committee to supply residents in the various districts with information concerning the proposed union districts, its advantages and how this system operates.

The next meeting will be held at Elizabethtown on June 10.
