



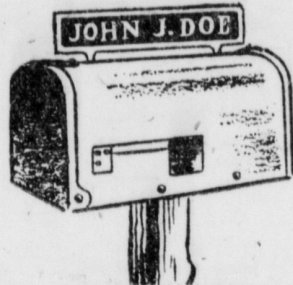

REV. ROBERT C. PIKE IS RETURNED TO MOUNT JOY
The Philadelphia Annual Conference of the Methodist Church re-elected the Rev. Robert C. Pike to serve as a Student Supply Pastor of the Mt. Joy and Salunga Methodist Churches for the Conference Year of 1952-53. The Annual Conference was held in the Arch Street Methodist Church in Philadelphia beginning Wednesday, May 14, and ending on Sunday evening, May 18. Bishop Fred Pierce Corson, newly elected President of the Council of Bishops of the Methodist Church presided at the Sessions of the Conference.

The closing session on Sunday evening was highlighted by the preaching of Dr. Harry Denman, and by the reading of the Appointments. Dr. Denman is Executive Secretary of the General Board of Evangelism of the Methodist Church. After the service Bishop Corson and the District Superintendents read the Appointments for the Conference Year 1952-53. Two thousand persons crowded the sanctuary of the Arch Street Church and as many as two thousand were turned away because the building was filled to capacity.

Rev. Pike is beginning his third year of service as pastor of the Mt. Joy and Salunga Churches. He is a senior in the Lancaster Seminary where he is studying to receive the degree of Bachelor of Divinity. Rev. Pike is a graduate of Albright College.
