

recipe of the week

Raisin Tapioca Pudding 1 egg white
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 Tablespoons quickcooking tapioca
fow grains salt
2/3 cup water
1 slightly beaten
egg yolk
2/3 cup Pet Milk
4/4 cup seedless
raisins
1 teaspoon vanilla
4 marshmallow halves
2 teaspoons jelly

egg yolk

Beat egg white until stiff. Beat in ½
cup brown sugar gradually. Heat to
boiling in saucepan a mixture of tapioca, ½ cup brown sugar, salt and
water. Boil over medium heat 5 minutes, or until tapioca is clear, and
mixture is thick. Stir in slowly a mixture of egg yolk, milk and raisins.
Stir over medium heat until mixture
comes to a boil. Boil and stir 30 seconds. Remove from heat and add vanilla. Fold in egg white mixture. Put
into 4 dessert dishes and chill. To
serve, garnish with marshmallow
halves topped with jelly.
