## RECIPE OF THE WEEK

**Raisin Tapioca Pudding**

1 egg white 1/2 cup Pet Milk  
1/2 cup brown sugar 1/4 cup seedless raisins  
2 Tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca 1 teaspoon vanilla  
few grains salt 4 marshmallow halves  
1/2 cup water 2 teaspoons jelly  
2 slightly beaten egg yolks

Beat egg white until stiff. Beat in 1/4 cup brown sugar gradually. Heat to boiling in saucepan a mixture of tapioca, 1/2 cup brown sugar, salt and water. Boil over medium heat 5 minutes, or until tapioca is clear, and mixture is thick. Stir in slowly a mixture of egg yolk, milk and raisins. Stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil. Boil and stir 30 seconds. Remove from heat and add vanilla. Fold in egg white mixture. Put into 4 dessert dishes and chill. To serve, garnish with marshmallow halves topped with jelly.
