



onion 4 teaspoon prepared horseradish 1 1/3 cups well-drained, canned cling peach slices
3/3 cup ice cold
Pet Milk

Soften gelatin in mixture of lemon juice and water. Heat peach syrup to boiling. Add softened gelatin and stir until dissolved. Cool, but do not chill. Mash cheese with fork. Blend in mayonnaise, salt, onion and horseradish until smooth. Stir in gelatin mixture. Chill until slightly thicker than unbeaten ergs whites. Put ½ cup. than unbeaten egg whites. Put 1/5 cup peach slices in bottom of oiled ring mold holding about 4 cups. Whip ice fold in rest of peach slices and celery. Put mixture into mold on top of peach slices. Chill until firm.
