STEHMAN'S
RECIPE OF THE WEEK
By Mary Lee Taylor
Strawberry Shortcake
Broadcast: May 24, 1952
1 1/2 cups biscuit mix
1 Tablespoon sugar
1/2 cup Fat Milk
1/2 cup water
1/2 cup ice-cold Fat Milk
4 teaspoons granulated sugar
2 teaspoons lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind
2 cups sweetened, mashed strawberries, fresh or frozen
laced sugar
Mix biscuit mix and 1 tablespoon sugar in bowl. Stir in a mixture of 1/4 cup milk and water. Turn out on lightly floured board and knead a few seconds, or until smooth. Roll 1/2 inch thick. Cut into 4 rounds with floured 3-inch cutter. Bake on ungreased baking sheet in hot oven (425) about 10 minutes, or until brown. At serving time, put ice-cold milk and 4 teaspoons sugar into small, cold bowl and whip with cold beater until fluffy. Add lemon juice and rind. Whip until stiff. Break open shortcakes while warm. Put together with strawberries. Serve with whipped topping. Makes 4 servings.
