If rent control is to be continued in Mount Joy after September 30, borough council must pass a resolution declaring that a housing shortage exists here, Burgess Charles Fish disclosed

"I don't know whether members of council can tell definitely whether the shortage is such that controls should be continued or not," Burgess Fish asserted, "and it seems to me that those who have been administering rent control should be in a better position to decide this."
