# Cow Breaks Record For Producing Milk

Brattleboro, Vt., June 30-Podonque Ollie Aaggie Bertha, a registered Holstein cow-owned by Joseph A. Hook & Herman Ginder, Jr., Mount Joy, Penna. has recently closed a long lifetime of high production totaling 100,434 pounds of milk and 3,712 pounds of butterfat on 2 milkings daily in 9 milking periods, covering a total of 2,502 days. (100,000 lbs. of milk is the equivalent of approximately 47,500 quarts.)

She was taken out of production at an age of 10 years after producing milk for approximately 4 years longer than the average U. S. cow.

Her highest single record was made at the age of 3 years 11 months when she produced 12. 657 pound of milk and 466 lbs. of butterfat.

Her production records are officially recorded by The Holstein-Friesien Association of America.
