of bidding contractors. They asked for the 10-day extension, school directors disclosed, in order to revise bids to coincide with current price boosts in steel and other building materials.

#### Improved Housing

The jointure, which includes Mount Joy and Marietta boroughs and E. Dongal Twp., has been set up to provide vastly improved school housing and gymnasium facilities for the 3 districts. Members of the authority and jointure directors currently estimate that the project will cost between \$1,500,000 and \$1,700,000.

Plans for the new structure have received state approval.

Schoolmen presently are working out details concerning the school's future water supply. Two sources of water are being considered, one involving an extension from Florin and the other from the extremity of a large main supplying Mt. Joy.
