AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY A PARTICIPANT IN THE FEDERAL SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE THEREFORE; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION AND AUTHORIZING PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS AND ALL OTHER ACTS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE SAID COVERAGE.

The Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, hereby ordains as follows:

WHEREAS, the Federal Social Security Act has been amended to permit political subdivisions to extend to their employees the benefits of the Old Age and Survivors Insurance System, and by Act No. 491, the 1951 General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania authorized the execution of an Agreement between the Commonwealth and each political sub-division to implement this coverage. Therefore:

SECTION 1. The Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, elects to participate in the Social Security System so that those persons employed on a regular and full time basis by the Borough Council shall receive Social Security coverage.

SECTION 2. The President of the Borough Council and the Borough Secretary are authorized to execute and deliver to the Secretary of Labor and Industry of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania the Agreement required by the aforesaid Act No. 491, so as to make the Borough a participant in the System as of July 1, 1952.

SECTION 3. The Borough Treasurer is designated as the person responsible for the local administration of the Plan, and he is directed to establish a system of payroll deductions, to make the necessary payments, and to do all other things necessary to effectuate said coverage.

SECTION 4. There is hereby appropriated from the unappropriated revenue of 1952 such sums as are necessary to pay the Borough's contribution for the balance of this fiscal year as required by the Agreement.
