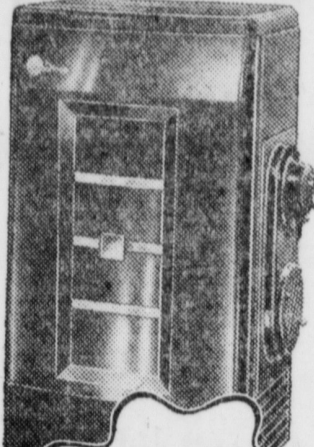

**Hot Potato Salad**

1/4 cup finely cut onion	3 Tablespoons water
3 Tablespoons hot fat	1/2 cup Pot. Milk
2 Tablespoons flour	2 1/2 cups diced, cooked potatoes
1 Tablespoon sugar	2 Tablespoons chopped parsley
1 teaspoon dry mustard	1/2 cup cut-up pickles
1 1/4 teaspoons salt	2 hard-cooked eggs, sliced
1/2 cup vinegar	

Cook onion slowly in fat 5 minutes. Blend in a mixture of flour, sugar, mustard, salt and pepper. Stir in mixture of vinegar and water. Boil for 2 minutes, stirring all the time. Remove from heat and stir into milk. Just before serving, mix with potatoes, parsley, pickle and eggs. Makes 4 servings.
