School Tax Increase Found Necessary To Meet First Years Rent For Joint School

\$32,000 Approx. Rent To Be Paid By Borough

If your school tax tag has taken a sudden jump in the wrong direction, don't let it increase your blood pressure as there is still a remote possibility that next year the tax will again be back to normal.

The Joint High School Building will be owned by the School Authority and not by the district and a rental of approximately \$82,000 to \$92,000 will have to be paid by the three districts composed of Mt. Joy, East Donegal and Marietta Borough.

Mount Joy Schools Ready For Opening

When teachers report for Faculty Meeting on Tuesday, September 2 and pupils report on Wednesday, September 3, they will find both buildings ready for occupancy.

New furniture has been ordered for Grades 5 and 6. This furniture consists of table and chair units to match the units purchased last year.

In the High School building all floors have been refinished, the Health Room painted, new window blinds in Room 102, the Gym floor refinished and the Auditorium floor repainted.

New electrical appliances are expected to be installed in the Home Ec Department by Mr. George Leaman, the local Westinghouse dealer, on the school replacement plan.

East Donegal Township Schools To Open Tuesday

East Donegal Twp. schools will open for the 1952-53 school year September 3, 9:00 a. m. All busses will follow the regular routes and all pupils are asked to come to the school they regularly attended on these busses.

Some first graders will go to school on a half session basis unless suitable quarters can be found. School will dismiss at noon the first day and at 2:40 for several weeks, after the first day.

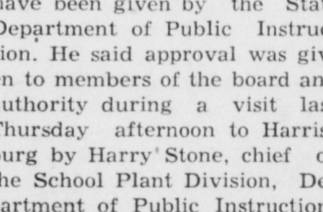

Boards To Decide

It was pointed out that each board is to be prepared at the next joint meeting to be held special individual sessions to vote approval or disapproval of the revised agreement.

Boards To Decide

One clause in the agreement, it was noted, is to be revised to insist that voting of all issues, whether they are of a minor or major importance, there must be a majority vote of all boards in order to pass each issue.
