Mt. Joy Not Considered A Critical Housing Area By Federal Agency

Thursday evening, September 2nd, will be the last regular meeting Borough Council will have before the expiration of the present rent control law. Whether the councilmen give consideration to the continuance of rent controls or whether they will table it is a question that could be of great importance to a good many

Mount Joy is not considered a critical housing area by the Federal Agency and whether controls are necessary is still a question to be decided by counough. Failure to take an infirmative action by September 30, The Landry Studios of Upper 1952 will result in the termination of the Rent Stabilization program locally on that date Eighty-three communities in Pennsylvania have already taken an affirmative action.

Should council arrive at an opinion that controls are not necessary because a serious housing shortage does not exist this opinion will not be subject to further question as to the adequacy of the finding. The method of determining whether a substantial shortage of rental housings exist is left entirely to the discretion of the Council-
