## Speculators Booming Spuds

Speculators in swarms have moved into the potato market, with results that are as yet unpredictable for potato farmers.

With potato prices decontrolled by Congress, what used to be a relatively quiet market has become one of the liveliest on the commodity exchanges.

The OPS, although it no longer controls potato prices, it watches them carefully because of the effect they may have on substitute foods which it does control.

High potato prices and a switch by housewives to cheaper substitutes would not only

affect the farmer, according to OPS, but would also create price pressures on the substitutes.

So far Maine potatoes have been the principal object of attention from new speculators all over the country. All past trading records have been smashed.

Trading volume on the Mercantile Exchange last January was 1167 carlots; in June it was 1918. By July it had jumped to 3263, then kept rising to 4061 at the end of August. It is still going up.

Since potatoes represent approximately three percent of the housewife's food budget, speculative price increases could have an important effect both on the farmer and on the cost of living.

## Weekly Letter Penna. Game Commission

Harrisburg Only

Archery Licenses Available At  
Archery licenses application blanks are obtainable from any hunting license issuing agent, but applications must be sent with the \$2.00 fee to the Department of Revenue at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, which is the only agency that issues archery licenses.

Any person applying for an archery license must have a resident or nonresident 1952 hunter's license. The archery license is required to hunt game of any kind during the open season on the two special archery preserves, or for male deer with two or more points to one antler during the special bow and arrow season.

It is not legal to use a cross bow for the purpose of taking any wild bird or animal any time in Pennsylvania.

Fox signs decrease in Northeast  
William A. Hodge, Wildlife Protector Assistant in the Game Commission's northeast division reports: "Men mowing refuges and propagation areas in counties where poison was placed during the rabies program say they see very few fox signs. The men mowing about these areas are the same men who did that job last year."

Game Protector Robert K. Benscoter, Laporte, Sullivan County, says foxes are showing up in his district — in a way.

Benscoter says that "In the past month or so we have been able to view and check some of the success in rabies campaign. When the farmers mowed hay they found as many as 4 to 6 dead in the field. I have received several reports of such cases."

Officer Uses Family Capacity  
Trap

Beavers have been causing damage in a locality within the district of Game Protector S. A. Kish, Avoca, Luzerne County. Residents asked that some of the beavers be removed.

Kish set live traps for the trouble-makers but at first had little success. Then, one day his efforts were rewarded with a prize catch. In a single trap he had taken not one beaver but a mother and two youngsters.
