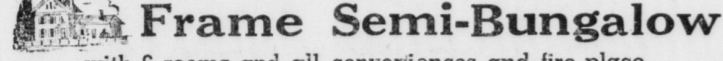

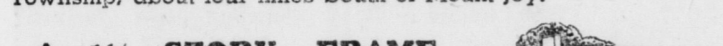

Local Pastor Elected Pres. '53 Conference

The results of the Pennsylvania Quiz given in Mt. Joy Hi School on September 22 are a tie for first place and a tie for second place. Charles Rovenolt and William Tyndall each had the high score of 96 with Clair Wagner and Genevieve Zimmerman placing second, each with a score of 94.

The quiz, sponsored by the Secondary Division of the Pennsylvania Department of Public Instruction with the Pennsylvania Retailer Association and the Pennsylvania Department of Commerce, was given to the seniors in the high schools in Pennsylvania to stimulate interest in the history, geography, people, resources, and industries of Pennsylvania. It consisted of 100 questions dealing with facts and figures of Pennsylvania history.

The winner in each high school will then write a 500-word essay in school on the topic "How Pennsylvania Schools are Helping to Defend Freedom." These will be mailed to Harrisburg where they will be judged on content and originality by a committee of college officials who will name the top ten essays. These ten will receive U. S. Bonds ranging from \$500 to \$50. The names of these winners will be announced during Pennsylvania Week, October 13 through October 19.

Because of the tie in Mount Joy High School, the two top scorers will write their essays which will be judged by a disinterested group to determine the top winner to enter the essay part of the State contest.

A dinner will be held at the Hotel Brunswick by the Retail Committee of the Lancaster Chamber of Commerce to honor all the Lancaster County winners at which each will receive \$10.

Cash prizes will also be awarded to the top scorers by the Mt. Joy Chamber of Commerce.
