Forry Wins \$20 Award

Col. Samuel Greenberg, Commanding officer of Marietta TC Depot presented awards totaling \$210 last Wednesday to six depot employees for suggestions to improve job operations. Albert R. Forry, Mount Joy R1, received \$20 award for suggesting the construction of equipment to simplify the handling of engines while on jacks. It is estimated this suggestion will save the government \$500 annually.

Frank E. Kloidt, 305 Union St., Columbia, received \$150 for suggesting the manufacture of a device for unloading turnbuckles which will fit the prongs of the fork lifts. Time and study revealed this would save the govt. \$5,169.60 annually.
