ter agricultural methods in Germany and Italy, presented an illustrated talk.

They renewed the school's membership in the Association Public School System, a co-operative group of school systems from all parts of the United States organized to pool and to share the best educational practices. East Donegal is currently active in the work of the citizenship Educational Project - designed to teach citizenship more effectively and to make civic duties more meaningful.

Supervising Principal, J. W. Bingham, reported an enrollment of 777 in the township schools; 383 in the junior-senior high school, 225 in Maytown Elementary, and 169 in Washington Elementary School, at Florin. He also reported that preliminary applications have been completed to have an East Donegal Teacher teach abroad in 1953-4 if possible, to have a foreign "exchange" teacher in the East Donegal Schools during the same period of time.
