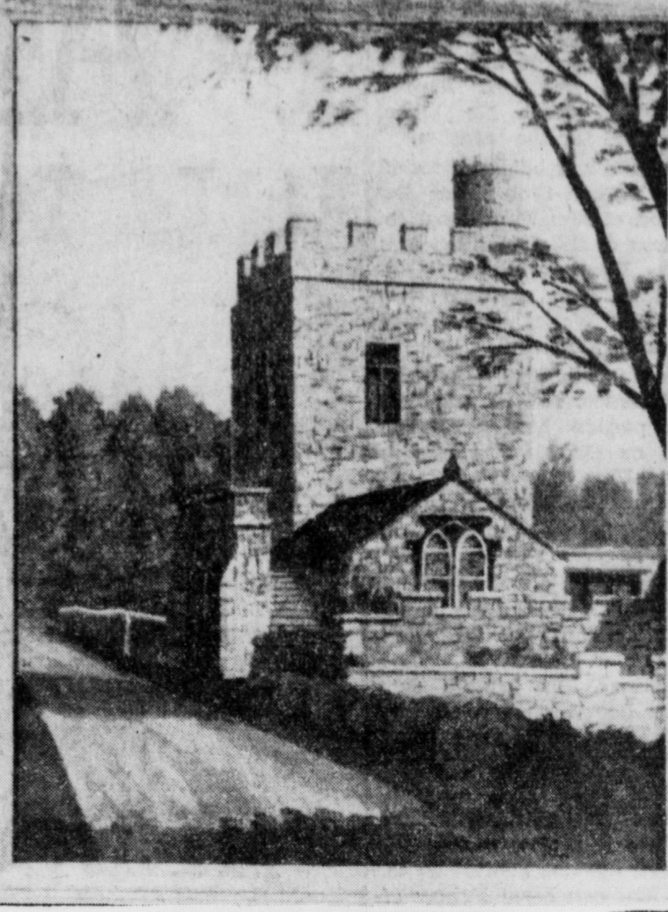

An oil painting exhibit depicting local, as well as historic scenes, will highlight the year's accomplishments of Linn W. Longenecker during the Mount Joy Community Exhibition. The showing represents a year of much brushing and dabbing and will include approximately 35 pieces of work. This feature will be located in the display window of the West Garage.

The above photo is taken of a recent painting depicting the Priory of Chilton-Super-Polden of Somerset, England. This historic cloister is located along one of the old Roman Roads of the English countryside. The stone used in this structure, built in 1836, were salvaged stones from wrecks of churches, which were demolished by the soldiers of Oliver Cromwell two centuries before. The masonry tools used in the constructing of this famous tower are still to be seen and the

builders name George Douden appears on the cornerstone. It was this Mr. Douden, who with his nine sons and two daughters, came to the United States in 1852. The Doudens were primarily builders and were founders of Doudentown, Schuylkill County, Pa. There are three grandchildren of George Douden residing in this area—Mrs. Mary G. Manley of Elizabethtown, Mrs. Charles Quick and Frank Douden, both of Lancaster.

Also exhibited are many local farm scenes, studies painted in the recent Art Class as instruction demonstrations and paintings of various local and favorite settings.

During the evenings of Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, also Saturday afternoon and evening, Linn will be present and at all other times he will have an attendant.
