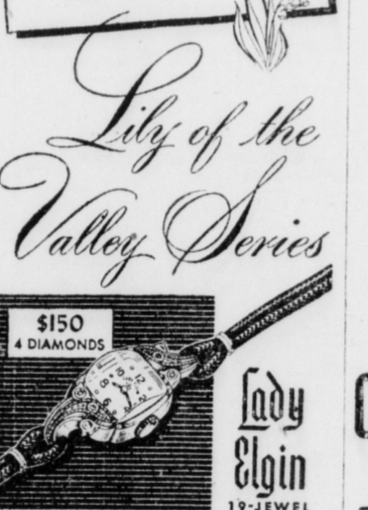
Vegetable, grain, flower and canned goods exhibits in the Sico Garages also were drawing comparatively large groups of spectators and attracting much favorable comment.
