**Former Resident Dies In California.**  
 Dr. Howard M. Engle who spent his boyhood in this borough died in the Hahnemann Hospital, San Francisco at 10:50 p. m. Monday, October 6. His death was announced over KGO and KNBC the following evening. He was born in Mount Joy on September 7, 1874, the son of Jacob H. Engle and Harriet G. Engle. Memorial services were held for him in the Calvary Presbyterian Church, San Francisco, and were conducted by Dr. Innes, pastor of the church, who was a friend. Dr. Visalini, now Dean of the Homeopaths in that area, and also Chief of the Hahnemann Hospital, delivered the eulogy. Dr. Engle graduated from Hahnemann College in Philadelphia, and also studied in Munich, Germany. After graduation he spent a short time in Kansas, then practiced medicine in Santa Cruz before going on to San Francisco, where he practiced until shortly before his death. His patients came from all over the United States, and he was consulted by doctors as far away as South America, and made several trips to Europe in the interest of his patients. For many years he was Dean of the Homeopaths in the West, Chief of Staff of the Hahnemann Hospital of San Francisco, which he also started in 1939, National President of the Hahnemann Society for several years and a member of the Homeopathic Society of England. Through this latter association he became a friend of Sir John Weir, one of the physicians to the Royal Family of England. He is survived by his wife Elizabeth and two daughters at home and the following brothers, Bruce of San Francisco, Henry J. of Mount Joy, and one sister, Mrs. Bertha M. Casey of Philadelphia, also several nieces and nephews.
