L. C. S. Sept. Report Welfare Work

The Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Inc. 129 East Orange St., Lancaster, submitted the following service report for September, 1952 by the executive secretary, Edna F. Schreiber, R.N.:

Three diagnostic clinics were held in September at the St. Joseph Hospital, with an attendance of 85, ten of whom were new patients. Three clinics were held at the Lancaster General Hospital, with an attendance of 33, four of whom were new patients.

One Brace clinic was held; 4 new braces were applied, and repairs and adjustments were made to 12 braces.

Two operations were performed.

Sixty-five office visits were made; 39 for physical therapy treatments, and 26 for follow-up.

Two hundred fifty-one home visits were made, 148 for physical therapy treatments, and 103 for follow-up.

Three visits were made to patients who were in the hospital. The Shriener's club transported 9 patients to the State Hospital for Crippled Children. The staff transported 7 patients to Philadelphia for plastic surgery and prosthesis adjustments, 2 children to the State Hospital for brace adjustments; and one Co. child to and from the City for demonstrations for Community Chest Campaign before service clubs.

3,826 miles were travelled by the staff.

Members of the Board gave ten hours of volunteer service.

A total of 226 patients were seen in this month, 17 of whom were new patients, their diagnoses constituting the following: 5 foot defects, 3 poliomyelitis, 1 measles encephalitis, 1 cerebral accident, 3 postural defects, 3 undiagnosed.

42 visits were made to patients in Mt. Joy area.

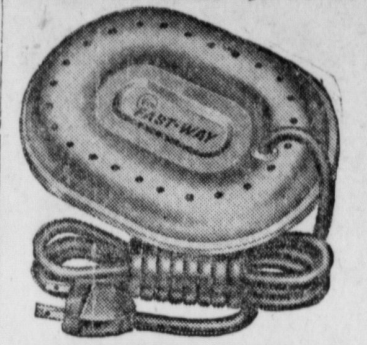
