The one-week 1952 bear season will open in Pennsylvania at 7 a. m., November 17, if rain or snow prior to that date has removed the woodland fire hazard. The season closes at 5 p. m., November 22.

of many who shoot first, look afterward.

An individual hunter may take one legal bear; a hunting party of 3 or more persons, 2 bears. A big game roster is required when 5 or more persons hunt together or in any way cooperate in hunting bears.

Automatic, semi-automatic or auto-loading guns of any kind are prohibited, but pump shotguns firing rifled slugs or pumpkin balls and high-powered rifles may be loaded to capacity in bear hunting. Firearms discharging .22 or .25 caliber rimfire cartridges of any description are prohibited.

In the six-day season last year 429 legal bears bagged in the Keystone State compare favorably with the average kill of other recent years. The state maintains its place among the top black bear states of the nation, despite the fact the human population is great and the bear hunting pressure increases each succeeding year.
