Legal Notice
RULES AND REGULATIONS OF BOARD OF HEALTH OF MOUNT JOY BOROUGH, LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNA.
 Section 1: Waste and Garbage
 (a) It shall be unlawful to place or throw on or near any street, ditch, gutter or public place within the limits of the Borough any liquid or solid vegetable or animal matter or organic waste substance of any kind, which will decay or become offensive.
 (b) It shall be unlawful to keep any garbage or other putrid or decaying animal or vegetable matter in any house, cellar or adjoining outbuildings or grounds for more than twenty-four hours unless said matter be kept in water-tight metal containers with tight-fitting lids. Said containers shall be emptied and thoroughly cleaned at least once a week.
 Section 2: Slaughterhouses
 (a) No person, firm or corporation shall build or operate any slaughterhouse within the limits of the Borough without first obtaining a permit from the Board of Health.
 (b) The keeping and slaughtering of all cattle, sheep, and swine shall be in the manner best adapted to procure their wholesomeness as food. Every butcher or other person owning, leasing or occupying any place where any cattle, sheep, swine, fowl or rabbit have been or are killed or dressed, shall cause such place to be thoroughly cleaned and purified, and all offal, blood, fat, garbage and offensive matter to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours. All wood-work except floors and counters in any such place shall be thoroughly painted or whitewashed, and the floor shall be protected so as to prevent blood or foul liquids or washings from settling into the earth beneath. The owners or occupiers of all slaughterhouses shall twice each week during the month of June, July, August and September disinfect the premises thoroughly with chloride of lime. In addition they shall remove the contents of any manure pit or manure piles on the premises once each week between such hours as may be designated by the Board of Health.
 (c) No pigs or hogs shall be kept in the same enclosure with a slaughterhouse, nor shall they be fed there or elsewhere upon the offal of slaughtered animals.
 (d) No blood pit, dung pit, offal pit, or privy well shall remain or be constructed within any slaughterhouse.
 Section 3: Noxious Odors, Gas and Smoke: Industrial Waste
 Any person, firm or corporation proposing to construct or maintain a manufactory or place of business where unwholesome or noxious odors, gas or smoke may be generated, or which shall produce offensive or deleterious industrial waste, shall obtain a permit from the Board of Health before proceeding. All such establishments which may be permitted shall be kept clean so as not to be offensive or prejudicial to public health. Offensive or deleterious waste substances or refuse shall not be allowed to accumulate on any premises, or be thrown or allowed to run into any public waters or streams, streets or public places. Any person or company conducting such manufactory or business shall use all reasonable means to prevent the escape of smoke, gases and odors, and to protect the health and safety of all operatives employed therein, and residents of neighboring properties.
 Section 4: Pig or Chicken Pens
 No pig, fowl or rabbit pens shall be built or maintained within the Borough within thirty feet of any street or of any inhabited house, unless a permit be obtained from the Board of Health. In addition any such pig, fowl or rabbit pen shall be constructed so that the floors shall be not less than two feet from the ground. All filth accumulating in and about and under the same shall be removed at least once a week, and oftener if so ordered by the Board of Health.
 Section 5: Septic Tanks, Cesspools and Privy Vaults
 (a) All cesspools, septic tanks and privy vaults shall be maintained in a sanitary condition. In addition no cesspools, septic tanks or privy vaults shall be cleaned except in a manner and at the time and under permit issued by the Board of Health.
 (b) From and after the date of the adoption of these regulations no sanitary sewer shall be constructed or extended through a cesspool, well or other underground place, except through a septic tank conforming to standard specifications of the United States Department of Agriculture or of the Pennsylvania Department of Health. No new cesspool or underground place intended to receive sanitary sewage shall be constructed or excavated except in connection with the installation of a septic tank conforming to specifications as above required. All laterals from cesspools or septic tanks must be laid sufficiently below the surface of the ground to prevent seepage from reaching the surface.
 Section 6: House Drains and Sewage
 (a) All sewer drains shall be water tight. No sewer drains shall empty into any lake, pond or other source of water used for drinking purposes or into any standing water within the limits of the Borough.
 (b) The sewage from each building on every street provided with a public sewer shall be conducted into said sewer.
 (c) All house drains more than four feet from the foundation wall shall be constructed of a type of pipe approved by the Board of Health. Any portion of the drain pipe under the building or outside and within four feet of the foundation wall shall be constructed of cast iron pipe with lead joints or wrought iron pipe with screwed joints, protected from rust. Waste pipes inside any building shall also be of cast or wrought iron pipe with joints as aforesaid. All joints in vitrified pipe shall be carefully cemented under and around the pipes. All joints and pipes shall be made air tight.
 (d) The house drain and other pipes for the conveyance of sewage shall be laid with a uniform grade and with a fall of not less than one inch to four feet, except in those cases where the Board of Health may permit otherwise.
 (e) Each pipe connecting a waste closet with a soil pipe shall be separately trapped. All other waste pipes shall be separately trapped close to the connections with each bath, sink, bowl or other fixture, unless adequate provision is made for downward ventilation through said waste pipe, in which case one trap for several fixtures. Double bowl sinks may have one trap for both bowls.
 (f) All soil pipes shall be carried through the roof and left open. A provision shall also be made for admitting air to the house drain side of the main trap, if such trap exists.
 (g) Curved pipes shall be used to change the direction of any waste soil pipe.
 (h) Before proceeding to construct or reconstruct any portion of the drainage system of a hotel, tenement, dwelling house or other building, the owner, builder, or person constructing the same shall file with the Board of Health a plan thereof showing the whole drainage system, together with the location and size of branches, traps, ventilating pipes and fixtures. Work when completed shall be subject to inspection by the Board of Health.
 (i) The Board of Health shall determine at any time that a drainage system has become a nuisance or otherwise dangerous to health of persons affected by it, the owner, upon reasonable notice shall reconstruct or alter it to eliminate the danger.
 Section 7: Unwholesome Food
 No meat, fish, poultry, fruit, vegetable or milk intended for human food, not being then healthy, fresh, sound and wholesome, fit and safe for such use, nor any animal or fish affected with or which died from disease, and no carcass of any calf, pig or lamb which at the time of its death was less than three weeks old, shall be brought within or offered or held for sale as food within the Borough.
 Section 8: Weeds
 No weeds or other vegetation which, either in themselves or as hosts of insects or plant diseases, may be harmful to the public shall be permitted by the owner of any premises within the Borough to grow or remain upon said premises or upon the sidewalk, curb or gutter adjoining.
 Section 9: Effect of Permit on Zoning Ordinances or Building Restrictions
 No permit issued by the Board of Health shall be deemed to waive or permit violation of any zoning ordinance or any building or use restriction contained in any deed.
 Section 10: Enforcement and Penalties
 Any condition which violates these regulations may be abated by the Board of Health or its duly authorized officers, as provided by law, or the Board. The Borough Health Officer, Constable or Policeman may institute proceedings against any person, firm or corporation violating any provisions of these rules and regulations.
 Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of these rules and regulations, upon conviction before the Burgess or Justice of the Peace shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$100.00 and costs for each offense, and in default, to undergo imprisonment of not less than three days nor more than thirty days. Each day's continuance of the offense shall constitute a new offense.

 It also bans the construction of any place of business where unwholesome or noxious odors, gas or smoke may be generated to the detriment of public health. The ordinance carries with it a \$100 fine or imprisonment for any violation.
