From Mount Joy to the new school site. Workmen of Penn Construction Co., he said, have completed installation of over 4,000 feet of pipe, representing nearly two-thirds of the lengths of the new water supply artery.
Hydrant Installed
Acting on recommendations of fire insurance underwriters, Wolgemuth added, a fire hydrant is being installed at the school site near the highway curb in front of the building. An eight-inch line is to be extended from that point along the Marietta Pike, then along the Iron Bridge road for a distance of approximately 300 feet to another fire plug installation. Cost of the school water line, which eventually will feed extension lines to new building developments in the future, will be in the neighborhood of \$50,000.

Regarding preliminary construction work on the school building Wolgemuth reported, 354 cubic yards of rock was excavated as of last week, when an inspection was made at the site. Concrete footings, he informed the schoolmen, are being poured as fast as ditches are being excavated.

Generally, he announced, members of the authority are pleased with progress made so far on both projects.

Financial Report
In a special financial report to the school directors, Wolgemuth announced that settlements had been made in the sale of school bond issue. Bonds with a total face value of \$1,575,000 were sold for \$1,550,272 plus interest from October 1, representing total net receipts of \$1,552,082. After deducting total disbursements of \$133,903, there was a temporary balance of \$1,418,179, of which \$1,322,005 was invested in U. S. Treasury Tax Anticipation Bills maturing on Jan. 22 and March 18, 1953, at a face value of \$1,330,000.

The interest earned by making this temporary investment, he pointed out, will be used for construction purposes and will serve as a "cushion" for contingencies.

Disbursements to date included the following items: reimbursement to individual school boards, \$2,000, which amount was advanced when the authority was named; reimbursement to U. S. Home Financing Agency, \$28,000; fees to Buchart Engineering Corporation, York, school architects \$21,176; printing, legal fees, etc., \$11,889; Mt. Joy Water Authority, \$50,000.

Invitation Plan
During the session of jointure school directors, at which A. D. Seiler of Mt. Joy presided, a proposal to invite directors of Mount Joy Twp. district to future sessions met with unanimous approval.

Mount Joy Twp. is negotiating to enjoin the southern part of the district with the Donegal jointure under a special working arrangement. Later, directors of the township hope to become a member of the consolidation.

Presently, Mt. Joy Twp. directors are negotiating with West Donegal Twp., Conoy Twp. and Elizabethtown borough to effect a similar arrangement for the northern portion of the township.

Budget Submittals
In order to expedite admission of the adjoining township sector into a temporary dual setup, Seiler requested that the school principals of the three districts of the Donegal jointure submit required operation budgets. The principals are: Dr. J. W. Bingham, East Donegal Twp.; Ralph D. Coleman, Marietta, and W. I. Beahm, Mt. Joy.
During the jointure session, Paul Portner, Marietta, reported results of a recent conference with state school officials in Harrisburg. Advice concerning the temporary arrangement with Mt. Joy Twp. was sought by the committee, which also consisted of Curvin Martin, E. Donegal Twp., and A. D. Seiler, Mount Joy.

Verbal approval to begin negotiations was given them by officials of the department, he disclosed.

ples and melon wedges make attractive salad container. A bit of lettuce leaf may be used, if desired, for green color notes.


