Two "No Parking Between Signs" will be placed on the south side of the street at the Mount Joy Mills.

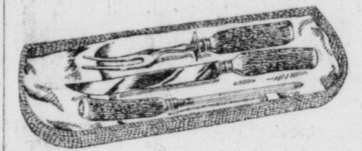
### To Write Letter

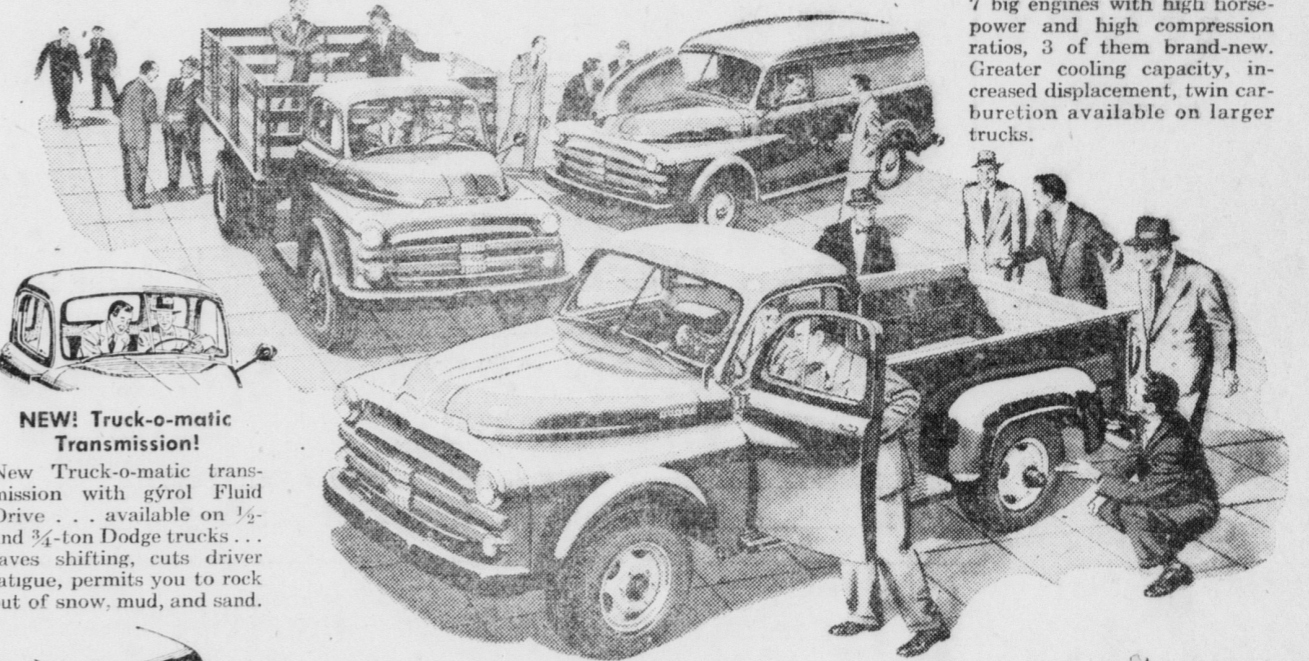
