vation was introduced, also Mr. Ivan McKeever, State Soil Conservation and Mr. Ralph Ruble, assistant.

Wayne Reutchler, secretary of the Board of Directors, presented the annual report.

During the year 1952, the directors approved 82 applications for conservation plans covering 8,660 acres in thirty-two townships.

Reports received from the various cooperation agencies indicated the work accomplished during the year.

Soil Conservation Service of U. S. Dept. of Agriculture
W. Martin Muth reported the Service has received 82 applications. Prepared 93 conservation guides, made 5 complete conservation plans with farmers, and made conservation surveys on 1,320 acres in the northwestern part of the county.

Extension Service U. S. Dept. of Agriculture
Mr. M. M. Smith reported the Extension Service has established several hundred demonstrations on soil erosion control, field, drainage, and farm pond construction throughout the county; it is planned to continue to use these demonstrations as educational material in the future.

Penna. Game Commission
Robert McKain assisted farmers in five cooperative Farm-Game projects totaling 33,686 acres, maintained 41 refuges covering 300 acres and purchased 14 strips of standing hay, corn and winter grain for meeting cover and food. The following material was distributed:

Rye grass seed, 1,500 lbs. Crow repellent, 179 pints; Multiflora rose plants, 178,400; Pine trees, 7,600; Shrubs, 8,000; Rabbits stocked, 184; Pheasants stocked, 911; Conservation practices installed, Contour strips, 237 acres; Woodland bordered cuttings, 16 acres.

Mr. McKain trapped 12 Red foxes, 47 Grey foxes and 28 Weasels.

Penna. Dept. of Highways
The District Engineer reported clearing many shoulder areas and cooperated in alleviating bad drainage conditions which affect farm areas.

Vocational Agriculture Penna. Dept. of Public Instruction
The Vocational Agriculture teachers have given a prominent place to Soil Conservation throughout the year in their classes.

The Directors of the Lancaster County Soil Conservation District wish to express their appreciation for the cooperation received from all the officials cooperating agencies.
