Auto Club Warns Of Drowsiness While Driving

Drowsiness and a "cat nap" in an easy chair at home can be most relaxing but it's another and very dangerous matter when you're behind the wheel of your car warns Edward P. Curran, Safety Director of the Keystone Automobile Club.

"Many highway accidents happen annually because drivers dozed for just a second," he continues. Whether caused by loss of sleep, fatigue, physical defect or long periods of monotonous driving, drowsiness always is a very real danger on the road and must be combated relentlessly.

"Some drivers pull off the road and curl up in their cars for a brief refreshing nap when drowsiness overtakes them; certainly a much safer practice than driving on. However, many more do not, for a variety of reasons.

"Getting at the source of L. drowsiness is a much better preventative, however. Those taking lengthy trips should eat lightly, break up the journey often with short stops for refreshments or merely to look at the scenery, and keep the mind the eye trained on the road and the task at hand . . . getting somewhere safely and comfortably . . . instead of letting thoughts wander, caution slacken and the eyelids drop.

"Falling asleep at the wheel has become the last great sleep for far too many drivers. Do your drowsing at home."

Completes Tests

Brattleboro, Vt. — With 451 pounds of butterfat and 11,269 pounds of milk testing 4.0% to her credit, Empress Montvic Betty Lou, a registered Holstein-Friesian cow owned by J. Lester Charles, Landisville, Pa., has completed a 336-day production test in official Herd Improvement Registry.

She was milked 2 times daily and was 5 years 8 months of age when she began her testing period.

Her record averages approximately 16 quarts of milk daily for the period covered by her test.

Testing was supervised by Pennsylvania State College, in cooperation with The Holstein-Friesian Association of America.
