**Records Show
Over \$200 Million
Paid In 1952
Milk Wages**

Harrisburg -- Milk furnishes
the income of 470,000 persons
in Pennsylvania, the Milk Con-
trol Commission said today.

The commission said this fig-
ure, which includes the families
of dairy industry employees,
represents four percent of the
state's population.

Farm population depending
on dairy farming for its income
numbers 275,000 while 132,000
get their livelihood from the
distribution of milk, the com-
mission said.

Last year's wages from milk
amounted to over \$200 million
commission records show.

The commission said dairy
products from all types of state
licensed milk plants had a con-
sumer value of \$800 million in
1952.

Made By Local Woman**

Funds totaling \$4,675 in char-
itable bequests were distribut-
ed by John L. Bowman in Or-
phans Court Thursday from the
estate of the late Annie Nauman
of Mount Joy, who died Jan. 17
1952 at the age of 84.

Total distribution in the es-
tate was \$19,786.66, of which
charitable bequests included
\$425 to the Good Shepherds
Home, Allentown; equal sums
of \$850 each to the Donegal
Presbyterian Church and the
Mount Joy Mennonite Church;
and \$2,550 to the First National
Bank and Trust Co. of Mount
Joy in trust.

income therefrom for needy
persons in the Borough of Mt.
Joy and in such surrounding
community as my said trustee
in its absolute and uncontrolled
discretion shall determine."
