

Safe Rat Bait Holder

THE farmer can make a rat bait holder that is inexpensive and also tafe for cats and dogs around the place. As illustrated, the poisoned bait is accessible only to the rodents, who enter and leave the self-feeder through 2-inch holes at floor level.

Used in the construction are ends and bottom of 1-inch by 6-inch lumber.

Dimensions of the rat bait holder are 18 inches wide, 16 inches high and 6 inches deep.

To keep out rats from buildings having breaks in walls or floors, Joseph De Fiore, Chicago exterminator who is president of the Illinois Pest Control Association, uses pieces of Masonite ¼" Tempered Presdwood. He simply attaches a panel an inch or two larger than the hole to be covered, using screws applied through drilled holes. He claims the material apparently isn't palatable to rodents, for he has had no complaints of its being gnawed through since he began using it several
