Duane Carter Enters Auto Races At Reading

First official entry for the east's inaugural AAA championship auto races, Sunday, March 29, at the Reading Fairgrounds, is Duane Carter, Los Angeles, Calif., fourth money winner at Indianapolis last year.

Carter, who also won the Middlewest AAA crown two years ago, wired his entry to race headquarters at Reading this past weekend. His official wire read:

"Accept this telegram as my entry for your 1953 opening American Automobile Association race season Reading Penn., March 29. Since having won the midwest championship in 1950 and the Ted Horn memorial races in 1950 and 1952 I am now planning to race your circuit with my Miracle power special in an attempt to win the Eastern AAA championship (signed) Duane Carter."

While winning the midwestern title, Carter out-spied many of the country's leading drivers including Troy Ruttman, Bill Mackey and Pete Romcevic. He followed Ruttman, Jim Rathman and Sam Hanks at the 1952 Indianapolis 500-mile.
