made with his class, chaperoned by the teacher with 35 to 40 students. Each student paying his own way, and the trips are taken during the school term.

On one of the trips Garber visited Berchtesgaden, Hitler's mountain retreat, also at his "tea house" on top of Jenner mountain. He also visited the Island of Sylt, summer home for the children of Hamburg built on sand dunes on an eight mile narrow strip of land. This island lies between Denmark and Germany. Another place was the School Home on the Elbe River, used as a health and recreation center for boys. The sleeping quarters are in the stables with the cattle. The countryside is sandy and covered with heather.

He also visited the Amsterdam area of Holland when he was selected to tell of his experiences in the exchange program to a meeting of American, Dutch, French, and German teachers.

They are Just as Anxious

Garber found a few of the German youth people a bit suspicious of him when he first joined them, but by learning their language and adapting their style of clothing it did not take long to meet them on an even basis to win their friendship. He found them just as anxious to learn about the Americans as he was about them.

Teachers and students at his school presented him with a trench coat, watch, and a pair of leather shorts which the German school boys wear. These are considered "wearable" until worn for about three years. A pair that is blackened from grime and wear is something to be quite proud of.

He was given an illustrated book on Hitler's Berchtesgaden, also one on the resort for children at Hamburg. Among his souvenirs is a large collection of coins from European countries, including East Russia, India, China. Also a handful of inflation money with the largest a 50 million dollar mark.

Says Youths Want Peace

Pointing out that it was just as confusing to find out what the average German was thinking as it is with the average American, the youth says he's convinced that the typical German youth wants peace and opportunities just as the typical American youth does.

Garber returned home on the USS United States superliner and will return to Haverford High School in about two weeks for graduation.

The principal of the Erica Schule, where Garber studied, has been invited by the American Friends Service Committee to visit this country and study our school systems. She will arrive in April in time to see her "goodwill ambassador pupil", Simon Garber graduate at the Haverford High School. Garber plans to enter Penn State for an agricultural course in the fall.
