The typewriter, which was made in Copenhagen, Denmark, and one of six in this country, is about the size of a portable and comes in a case. It has six keys and a space bar, arranged like the black keys of a piano.

Designed to save arm and hand energy, the Braille typewriter will help Joann write faster. She plans to use it for her home work and correspondence with her Braille Pen Pals.

Joann is already quite proficient in the use of the typewriter since she has been taught to use one by the workers from the Blind Association. The gift came as a complete surprise to her and made her very happy. Joann, who was fourteen on Feb. 17, is very busy with fifth and sixth grade work via the dual communication system which was installed last fall between her bedroom and the school classroom.



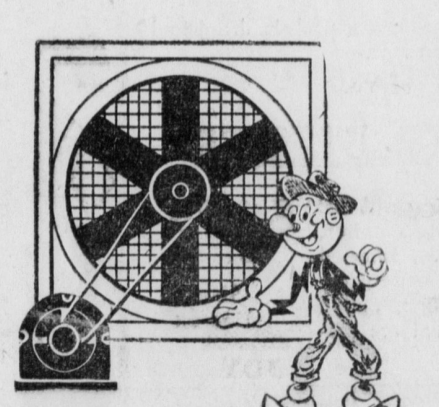
