### Tax Cut For E. Donegal Twp.

It is no longer news when we hear that taxes are going up but it is news when we hear that taxes are going down. The East Donegal Township school directors made news when they met last Thursday and decided that at least three mills can be sliced from the Twp. property taxes during the coming fiscal year. Present property assessment for school purposes is 25 mills.

The schoolmen were elated to discover further that if present revenues continue, the downward trend in tax rates will continue in future years toward the normal 18-mill rate.

Anticipated receipts for the coming year, according to the tentative budget studied at last Thursday's meeting, calls for personal per capita levies, property taxes and appropriations totaling well over \$230,000. These figures were based upon the current 25-mill assessment and increased appropriations and reimbursements.

**Economics Incorporated**  
In spite of a sharp increase in cost of instruction, due to compulsory teacher salary increases mandated by state law, school administration recommendations for economies in school operation and maintenance were incorporated into the budget structure making it possible to limit total expenditures to slightly over \$217,000.
