Coach John Day's Rams defeated Marietta in their first league baseball game of the '53 season with Charles Zeller pitching a no-hit no-run game. Of 18 players at bat for Marietta, Zeller struck out 12. This was his second shut out in two seasons.

The Score 10-0
In the first inning, Johnson for Marietta gave up a hit to Zeller. He waded Ashenfelter. White Kear was at bat, Zeller came in for the first run of the game. Johnson walked Kear and was taken and replaced by Druck. While Druck was pitching to Zimmerman, Ashenfelter stole home. Zimmerman walked. When Clinger was at bat Kear stole home. Clinger struck out and then Zimmerman came in. Druck then struck out Klugh. Miller had a double and was brought home by a triple by Germer. Hallgreen walked and Zeller hit to the pitcher for the third out.

Zeller struck out the Marietta batsmen in order. Johnson, pitching for Marietta again, gave a hit to Ashenfelter who went to third on a single by Kear. Zimmerman had a fielder's choice which made Ashenfelter out at home. Then Kear was out trying to steal home. Clinger got a double. He was followed by Klugh who had a single scoring Zimmerman. On a wild pitch, Klugh went to second and Clinger scored. Miller hit to the pitcher, who threw him out at first.

Zeller struck out Johnson and Sargen next. He walked Seaman, who stole second, then struck out Fahringer.

In the third, Germer popped out. Hallgren hit a single and Zeller flied out. Ashenfelter has his second single, and Kear got a single scoring Hallgren. Zimmerman walked; Ashenfelter stole home. Clinger had a single, and Zimmerman was caught stealing second.

In this inning Zeller struck out three consecutive men.

In the fourth Klugh and Miller had singles; Germer struck out, and Hallgren bunted a sacrifice to the pitcher, scoring Klugh. Zeller flied out.

For Marietta Gohn popped out. Druck walked, stole third and was out trying to steal home. Johnson struck out.

For Mt. Joy, Ashenfelter popped out, Kear walked, stole second. Zimmerman walked; Clinger flied out, and Klugh popped out.

In the last inning Zeller walked Seaman, who stole second & third and was out trying to steal home. Zeller then struck out the next two batters. The game was called because of cold and darkness.
