### Governor Commends School Safety Patrols

In a statement made April 23 Governor John S. Fine said: "For nearly four decades, the School Safety Patrol program in Pennsylvania has grown steadily. Created in 1914, the program gained impetus thru official recognition by the 1931 Legislature. Today, more than 38,000 of these youthful guardians of the crossroads are serving throughout the Commonwealth.

"The teaching of safety has become a major responsibility of the schools and the safety patrols have been one of the most effective features of this program and in lessening childhood traffic deaths during the past 20 years.

"Patrol members with their Sam Browne belts and badges and with their enviable records are recognized everywhere as a symbol of safety for children on their way to and from school.

"To honor the fine record of these boys and girls who protect their schoolmates, the week of May 4, 1953, has been set aside as 'School Safety Patrol Week.' I take this opportunity to commend the members of the School Safety Patrols for their work. I urge everyone to pay tribute to the boys and girls who are enrolled in these patrols and to give their full cooperation to the youthful citizens in his traffic safety effort."

### A Minister

Lesson for May 3, 1953

**GOING UP** in a canal-boat to the interior of China or somewhere, stopping now and then to preach a sermon and distribute some Testaments and then showing along to the next stop—this is some people's idea of foreign missions, but it won't do. It isn't the way the best work has been done. And it most certainly is not the New Testament way of spreading the Gospel. St. Paul, for instance, traveled many a mile, and he is known for his "missionary journeys." But an examination of the New Testament story shows that his journeys were mostly stops, some of them right long ones. Paul believed not only in preaching the Good News but in establishing churches. He stayed in Corinth a year and a half, and in Ephesus two whole years. He left going congregations behind him at both places, and he kept up with them for years.

### Minister

All sorts of names are given to ministers. Some call them "Reverend," a title hanging over from the Middle Ages and one that most ministers, to tell the truth, would just as soon not have. Some call them "preacher," and they do preach; but few ministers preach for more than two or three hours out of the 168 hours in the week. A bigger word and a better word is just "Minister." This is a word St. Paul used about himself, and it was not original with him. Our English language rather conceals the fact that the word means "One who serves," for in the Greek that Paul used, the word "serve" and the word "minister" are almost the same. Minister does not mean "servant" in the cap-and-apron, hired-man sense of the word. It does mean one who is of service. There is one country minister in North Carolina, much loved by his people, who not only preaches and cares for the souls of his people but who has shown them how to raise strawberries better than were ever grown in those parts before. He spells Service in letters that spread over all of life.

### Teacher

If all you get out of church is a "good feeling," you don't get what was intended, or else your minister isn't quite up to his job. The minister who takes St. Paul for his model will be a teacher and not simply a preacher. We know that Paul at Ephesus taught in the lecture-hall of Tyrannus every week-day, perhaps Sundays too. The good minister's sermons will be a kind of education; but he does not stop there. The minister can't teach all the classes in Sunday School but he can see to it that the Sunday school selects good teachers. He can oversee the whole business of religious education in his church, check on what is being done, help to plan with the teachers and other workers, see that the teachers have a chance to attend training classes, help build up the Sunday school library... there is hardly any end to what the minister can do as a teacher, if he has half a mind in that direction. Above all, the minister is the Bible teacher.

### Pastor

When all is said and done, however, there is no finer word than Pastor, and no higher work than what he does. There simply is not anywhere any institution except the Christian church that has anything like the place and work of the pastor. An old-fashioned name for this is the "cure of souls" and that never meant just the cure of sick souls, but also the care of souls to keep them from being sick. Paul, when he was reviewing his work in the church at Ephesus, could have mentioned some of the startling and sensational events which Luke mentions in chapter 19. Instead, Paul describes his own day-to-day, door-to-door work as pastor of his people. To put it as simply as possible, the pastor brings God into the lives of his people, and brings his people to God. While the minister may have a salary, as in most churches he does, he can never be paid for what he does as pastor. How can we pay a man in money for comfort and warning and faith and strength, that we would not have known without his help?

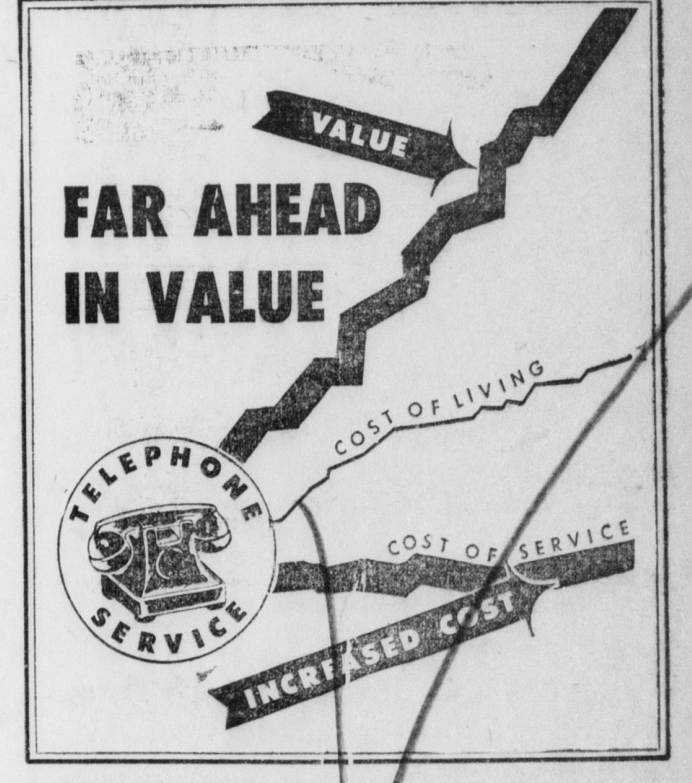
