**Ben Clinger And Jack Beaton
Win Doubles Championship**

Ben Clinger and Jack Beaton, who had to default their chances of taking the Inter-County Doubles Tennis title 2 weeks ago because of a baseball game, came back last week to win the District 3 doubles championship.

Each was awarded a medal and will represent District 3 in the State Tournament at State College this Friday and Saturday.

They had little trouble in winning the title, taking every match in straight sets except one. That was a battle with Stan Stout and Morris Frederick of Lititz, who previously had been undefeated in league and tournament play.

In the opening round they took Allan York and Jack Shertzer of McCaskey High 6-2 and 6-2. Second round play found them paired against Carl Longenecker and Charles Weaver, Manheim, and they won easily, 6-0 and 6-3.

Quarter-finals pairings saw them take 7-5 and 6-2 sets from Phil Cake and Clayton Kaufman, Hershey. In the semi-finals they stacked up against the Lititz pair in the finals. Ronnie tennis to win, 6-4, 5-7, 9-7.

Playing against another Lititz pair in the finals, Ronnie Runk and Ted Davidson, they reverted to their straight set form, winning 6-3 and 6-3 to take the title.

Mt. Joy finished third in team total with eight, trailing McCaskey, nine, and Lititz, 11.

Peter Nissley, another local netman, bowed in the quarter-finals of singles play, to John Thomas, McCaskey, 6-1, 6-2.
