Remembering that to this man Jesus had said "Today shalt thou be with me in paradise" he continued by stating that while much cannot be known of paradise until we die ourselves, much can be known through God's word. He emphasized that those who died serving their country were with Jesus, that they needed not to worry any longer, that they suffered no longer, and that in heaven "God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes."
