### General Hospital Campaign Went Over The Top

The 1953 Charity and Maintenance Campaign of the Lancaster General Hospital went over the top by a sum of \$11,421, it was announced this week by Leslie S. Hubbard, president of the hospital board of directors, in his annual report.

The final report on the drive was presented to the board by Richard Oblander, gen. chairman, John S. Wise was general co-chairman.

The total showed \$119,961 subscribers. Total goal was \$108,540. The amount received over the goal is to be used toward reducing the deficit in the building fund. In addition a total of \$4,400 was contributed, pledged directly to the building fund.

The final reports showed that the City Division raised a total of \$70,966, far above its quota of \$58,000. The County Division exceeded its goal of \$35,540, raising \$39,644. Manheim Twp. Special Division raised \$9,350 toward its \$15,000 quota.

In announcing the success of the drive, the leaders and hospital board paid tribute to the outstanding work done by the volunteer groups of men and women who canvassed residential districts in city, boroughs, towns, and small rural settlements.
