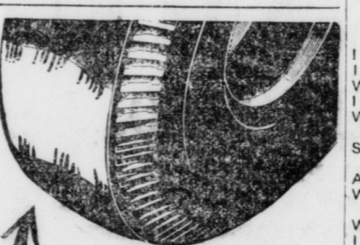

**BERRIER CLAN WILL MEET AT FLORIN AUGUST 2**

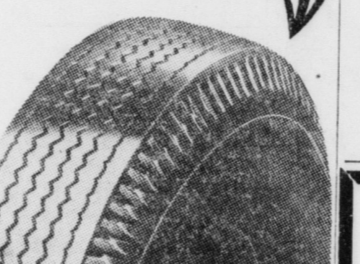

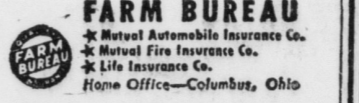
**PERRY COUNTY REUNION SATURDAY, JULY 25th**
